Angela Packer McGhie, CG, is a professional genealogist who has focused her career on genealogy education. She is the coordinator for the Intermediate Genealogy course at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research (IGHR), and the coordinator of the Advanced Evidence Analysis Practicum at the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy (SLIG). She served as the administrator of the *ProGen* Study Program from 2008-2014 and is now on its board of directors. Angela has been an instructor at GenFed (formerly NIGR) in Washington, D.C., the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh (GRIP), and Howard Community College in Columbia, Maryland. She is a contributing author for the *APG Quarterly* and in 2010 was honored with a formal certificate of appreciation from the Association of Professional Genealogists for her leadership and service.
